ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

The School of Business
SOUTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY

As members of the South Carolina Higher Education community, Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College and South Carolina State University recognize the needs of students who desire to pursue post-secondary educational opportunities in the State of South Carolina, particularly the specific geographic area around these institutions.

To support the continuous growth in economic development of the State of South Carolina, both institutions recognize the importance of management education programs to prepare future business leaders. Thus, for economic growth, development, and prosperity, smooth access to higher education opportunities must be made available to all citizens. This accessibility must be there for the current high school graduates as well as the mature students who recognize and accept the need for higher education.

The transfer agreement articulated below, between the Business and Computer Technology Division at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College and the School of Business at South Carolina State University, assures that students who successfully complete academic credit courses of study on the attached list at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College may transfer those courses, with full credit, to South Carolina State University. Also, students who successfully complete academic courses of study on the attached list at South Carolina State University may transfer approved courses to Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College.

In addition, as part of the student recruitment program of the School of Business, this agreement establishes a commitment from the School of Business at South Carolina State University to actively recruit graduates with an Associate Degree from the Business and Computer Technology Division at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College. To that end, the School of Business agrees to sponsor two activities each semester at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College to include: (1) a student presentation on career and internship opportunities in business, and (2) a faculty presentation on a business related issue. The School of Business at South Carolina State University also agrees to host an "OCTC Faculty and Student Day" during Accounting Awareness Week in the Fall Semester and during the month of February in the Spring Semester. It is further agreed that faculty and students at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College will be invited to participate in the Business Week activities of the School of Business during the Spring Semester each year.

The specifics of this agreement are:

1. Students who complete courses on the attached list in the Business and Computer Technology Division at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College will satisfy courses that meet the General Education, Business Core and/or major requirements of the School of Business at South Carolina State University. All applicable credit hours with a grade of "C" or better will transfer to South Carolina State University toward a Baccalaureate Degree Program within the School of Business or to Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College as appropriate.
2. Students entering into a Baccalaureate Degree program in the School of Business at South Carolina State University will be subject to the requirements specified in the catalog that is current at the time of their matriculation into the program.
3. Individual analysis of student transcripts will be made for credits accumulated under the semester system at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College and South Carolina State University.
4. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College and South Carolina State University will determine the applicability of the transfer courses in meeting graduation requirements. The institutions reserve the right to modify requirements in accordance with the Commission on Higher Education guidelines, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) accreditation standards, AACSB-The International Association for Management Education accreditation standards, and the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP).

The attached list is part of this document and sets forth courses that satisfy General Education, Business Core, and or major requirements of the School of Business at South Carolina State University and the equivalent courses at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College.

Courses presented for transfer credit in the major areas in the School of Business at South Carolina State University will not be accepted for transfer credit if they are offered at South Carolina State University at the junior or senior level. However, students transferring from Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College who have taken courses that were not accepted for transfer credit because of the leveling may obtain credit by passing the appropriate CLEP test or departmentally prepared and administered examination.

This agreement does not provide for a complete match of curricula at the two institutions. Thus, each institution and its authorized representatives agree to provide transferring students with relevant, current, and sound academic advice to prevent loss of legitimate credit hours or time in a student's attempt to secure the Associate and/or Baccalaureate degree.
