

AGREEMENT

between

ORANGEBURG-CALHOUN TECHNICAL COLLEGE

and

THE COUNCIL ON AGING

April 1, 2004 - March 31, 2005

Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College admits qualified students regardless of race, sex, color, or creed and provides equal educational opportunity for all students admitted.

THIS AGREEMENT sets forth the terms and conditions under which students from the Nursing Assistant Program at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College will receive selected teaching-learning experiences in homemaking at The Council on Aging.

The Nursing Assistant Faculty SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING DUTIES:

1. Meet and maintain recommended state and national standards relative to the organization and administration of Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College, in accordance with standards of appropriate accrediting agencies.
2. Be responsible for the educational experience and all planned learning experiences of students as related to program objectives, and provide appropriate faculty for this purpose. The selection of teaching-learning experiences by faculty will be made in cooperation with designated personnel at The Council on Aging.
3. Provide onsite faculty supervision of students in the client's home.
4. Make long-range plans with regard to the specific resources needed for student experience to include: maximum number of students to be assigned; dates, time schedules, and homes.
5. Be responsible for student health services as described in the Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College Catalog. (All students in Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College are encouraged to carry the student health and accident insurance policy available to them or its equivalent.
6. Through joint planning and appropriate action, participate in the improvement of delivery of home care services.

THE COUNCIL ON AGING SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS:

1. Will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, war-related disability, or veteran status and will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, sex, national origin, war-related disability or veteran status.
2. Meet and maintain recommended local, state, and national standards relative to the organization and administration of The Council on Aging, in accordance with standards of appropriate accrediting agencies.
3. Make facilities of The Council on Aging available to students and faculty of Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College for the purpose of carrying out the objectives of the educational nursing program.
4. Maintain responsibility for client care while cooperating with Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College faculty in making selected learning-teaching experiences available to students. Full responsibility for client care is at all times controlled by The Council on Aging.

ORANGEBURG-CALHOUN TECHNICAL COLLEGE NURSING ASSISTANT DEPARTMENT AND THE COUNCIL ON AGING AGREE THAT:

1. The resources of The Council on Aging may be utilized for selected teaching-learning experiences in the Nursing Assistant Program of Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College, as specifically reviewed by The Council on Aging and the Group Director of the Division of Nursing at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College.
2. Appropriate agency personnel (Director/Supervisor) may share in the evaluation of student achievement in terms of pre-stated behavioral objectives of the teaching-learning experience.
3. This Agreement shall be effective on April 1, 2003 and end on March 31, 2004. It is mutually agreed and understood that this agreement may be renewed for a term not to exceed two (2) years. Notice of intent to renew shall be furnished no later than 30 days prior to the end of the term of this agreement.
4. This agreement may be terminated in the following manner: (1) By either party for breach if there has been a failure to cure after thirty (30) days written notice; (2) At any time by mutual agreement; and (3) Upon written notice of either party given at least 100 days prior to the effective date of such cancellation; provided, no termination shall be effective as to affect an academic semester which is in progress.


5. It is understood that the students are not employees of The Council on Aging and are not covered under any Council on Aging liability insurance policies. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College agrees that students and nursing faculty will have insurance for professional and general liability for acts of omission occurring at The Council on Aging.

6. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College will provide Worker's Compensation for students to insure against injuries sustained in the clinical site while participating in subject program. Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College will furnish proof of coverage for all students enrolled in subject program.


